Skin cancer is the most common cancer in Ireland, with over 13,000 new cases diagnosed every year in Ireland. The National Cancer Registry of Ireland (NCRI) expects this number to double by 2040.

Workplace and corporate mole reviews offer a proactive approach early detection and if diagnosed early, up to 90% of cases are curable. In the case of melanoma picking up on it early can save a life. For this reason, we feel it is important for everyone to be skin aware, to perform monthly self-checks for changes, and for at-risk individuals, regular screening should be considered.

Additionally, workplace and corporate skin checks provide an opportunity for education. Skin health awareness is vital for individuals to understand the risks, recognise suspicious spots or moles, and take necessary precautions to protect themselves from harmful sun exposure. Skin checks not only detect cancer, but also empower individuals to make informed decisions about their skin care routines and sun protection measures.



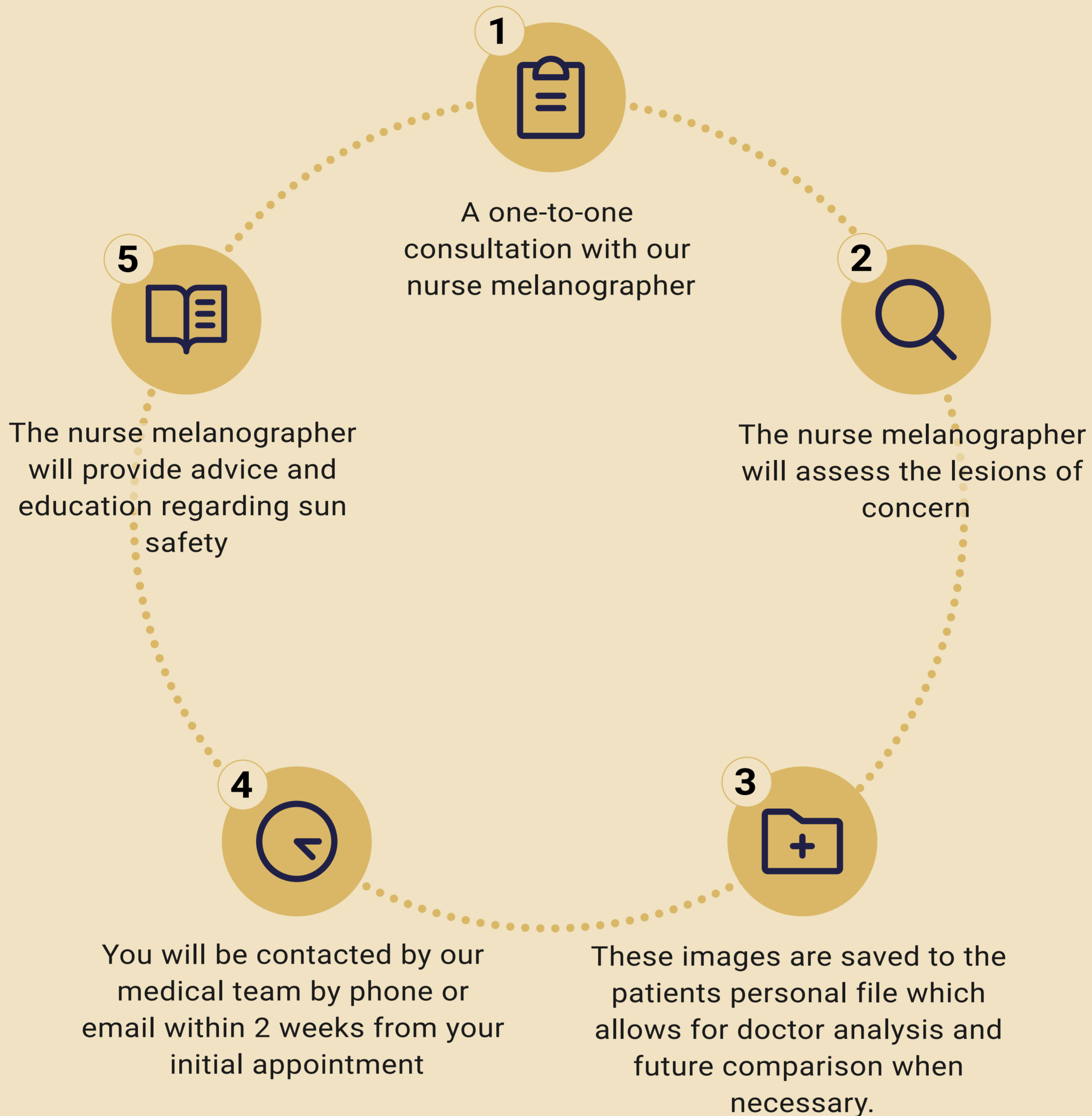
## What we do onsite

A Rose Clinic melanographer will be able to attend your place of work and perform on-site Mole Checks through the means of Digital Dermoscopy. Dermoscopy is a non-invasive tool for the early detection of Skin Cancer.

This method is based on microscopy of the skin surface, a 20x magnified view of the lesion, allowing for better visualization of the internal structures of a lesion. This has been shown to be a reliable and sensitive method for detecting early-stage skin cancer by identifying characteristics that may potentially be an indicator for skin cancer that have yet to become visible to the natural eye.

Each patient/employee would be allocated their own appointment slot. Each appointment will take between 15 minutes depending on the individual.

This appointment will include:



We can check up to three (3) lesions of concern per person, anywhere on the body, and can assess up to 20 individuals per day. All we require is a well-lit room, and a secure Wi-Fi connection.

## Why get a Mole Check?

For those who find themselves in a high-risk category, regular full body mole screening may be recommended. There are a number of factors that may make an individual more likely to develop skin cancer.



A family history of melanoma



A history of sunburn



Excessive ultraviolet (UV) light exposure



Having many moles or unusual moles



Weakened immune system
